Northwest Sound ... The First 10 Years

In 1984, 25 local singers determined there was enough interest to create a Puget Sound area elite chorus. By 1985, we had a director, Bob Brock, and a charter. By October, the Northwest Sound Chorus was created.



Our third district championship, in 1990, came with our new director, Bobby Gray, Jr. Bobby arrived with a dream of a large chorus, so he convinced us to merge with our sponsor chapter, the Lake Washington Skippers, starting the "bigchorus" era.

We went on to win our first District Championship in Calgary in 1986 and represented the district at the Hartford International Contest in 1987 (below). The chapter's "elite chorus" era continued with another District championship and a trip to the Kansas City International Contest in 1989.

In 1990, the chorus decided to find a new director. We also toured Europe, led by our interim directors, Northwest Sound members Jim Kahlke and Stu Turner.

In the early years, the Northwest Sound hosted many cabarets. In 1987, we moved to the Fifth Avenue Theater. We hosted the Hi-Lo's at the Fifth in 1989.

Northwest Sound went to the next three International Contests. We had over 90 on stage and placed ninth in New Orleans in 1992 and ninth in Calgary in 1993 (below).

We took an "Off Year" from contests to tour England, Scotland, and Wales. We celebrated our 10th anniversary with our sixth trip to the International Contest - in Miami in 1995.

During the "big chorus" era, we held annual shows at the Fifth Avenue and the Paramount. We presented annual Holiday Shows, too. With Bobby a member of the Association of International Champions (AIC), we hosted two AIC shows right here in the Northwest.





Finding Ourselves ... 1996-2005

We spent the early years of our second decade trying to "regain our momentum" while continuing our big venue shows. We re-auditioned the entire chorus and created a Monday night rehearsal for learning notes. Wednesday's rehearsal was only for polish.

During the 90's we sang at many Mariners Games and even a Seahawks Game.

In 1997, Bobby Gray Jr. announced that he needed to leave the area for family reasons. His last performance with the Northwest Sound was at our Vocal Majority Show in November, 1997.

This decade was our era of finding ourselves. After Bobby left, we brought Bob Brock back for a couple of years. Bob Tried individual voice lessons, but we kept shrinking. Bob decided to step down after we competed at the 2000 Division Contest with only 25 on stage.

We then hired Stu Turner to lead us. With Stu, we began to regrow. We had some fun shows in this era including a Greatest Hits show. With this show, we reconnected with a few more familiar faces. In 2002, we traveled to Alaska for the District Contest.

In 2004, we brought in Denny Stiers after he moved back into the area from Eugene. With Denny, came even more singers. Under Denny and Stu, the chorus grew back to 75 men. Our second decade peaked with a win at the 2005 District Contest in Calgary, which qualified us for the 2006 Indianapolis International contest.

Building Through Education ... 2006-2015

After placing 20th in Indianapolis in 2006, we moved on to a new director, Donny Rose, and an "educating and building" era. Donny helped create the "sing, Sing, SING!" program, which helped us expand our youth outreach. We also had many younger family members in the chorus at this time.

Change and Challenge ... 2016-2025

With our fourth decade came an era of change and challenge. We kept ourselves together through Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS) changes and a pandemic. Right from the start Ken fully embraced the "sing, Sing, SING!" program, we fostered a youth chorus for a short time, and we ran several quartet initiatives. In response to BHS introducing the "Everyone in Harmony" program, we created Northwest Mix and welcomed women into the chapter.

The Northwest Sound continued to win district contests, qualifying for the next two Internationals. In 2017, we drew first in the chorus

contest so we created our own parodies to honor the occasion.



We were growing, both in numbers and in skill - continuously outscoring ourselves. After taking a year off from contests to attend Harmony University, we won our 11th district championship and at the 2019 International Contest in Salt Lake City, we achieved our highest scores.

After qualifying for the 2020 International, everything changed with the pandemic. But the chapter didn't stop. We made it through with "Carbershop" and a virtual Holiday Show. During Carbershop, members of the choruses met at the Bellevue Square parking lot. Each car had a microphone attached to a central system that broadcast over FM radio so everyone could sing together.
